FIGMENT* 2008 3-DAY PARTICIPATORY ART EVENT OPENS JUNE 27
ON GOVERNORS ISLAND

Over 200 Artists to Celebrate Creative Culture and Non-Commercial Art with the Public

FIGMENT 2008, a free, non-profit, non-commercial participatory arts event, will take place on Governors Island from June 27-29 from 10 am - 6 pm. The public is invited to participate in the highly interactive and collaborative art exhibits, performances, events, and workshops, encompassing all media (see list of events) at this outdoor event. Admission and ferry to the island are FREE. (www.FIGMENTnyc.org).

From world-class artists to the inspired individual, FIGMENT offers an opportunity for everyone to engage in the creative experience. The goal is for everyone to participate, and visitors of all ages and backgrounds are encouraged to come to FIGMENT and be a part of whatever sparks their spirit and imagination. Build, paint, sing, experience, think, wonder, listen, create, dance, wander: In short, the public can PARTICIPATE in a vast array of imaginative experiences that over 200 artists of FIGMENT have conceived -- or bring their own games, costumes, activities, or small works of art. FIGMENT has moved art from the pedestal onto the front lawn for everyone to enjoy.

The success of FIGMENT is dependent on community participation. “We wanted to create an arts event that lowers the barrier for people to participate,” says David Koren, the Executive Producer of FIGMENT. “At FIGMENT, everyone can play a part—artists, performers, activity organizers, and volunteers. The event will scale in proportion to how many people are interested in playing a part in making it happen. It’s like one large collaborative art project, that you can be a part of.”

FIGMENT began last year to build community among artists and their audiences, foster the participatory arts in New York City, and demonstrate a vision for the future of Governors Island as an arts destination.

FIGMENT is a community-based event organized and run by over 100 volunteers who have planned, curated, and produced the entire happening with some grant support and donations. The event is non-commercial and decommodified. There are no corporate sponsors, and no works of art or souvenirs are sold. The community of artists, volunteers, and participants that make FIGMENT happen respect the environment and are committed to leaving no physical trace of their activities.

Why Participatory Art?

Because of its interactive nature, participatory art can be a vehicle for personal and social transformation. Participatory arts include any works of art that require interaction from participants, such as installation art, costuming, interactive performance, and games. These activities bring together artists and community members in ways that build relationships and encourage individual creativity.

GETTING TO GOVERNORS ISLAND:

The Governors Island Ferry departs from the Battery Maritime Building at 10 South Street, in Lower Manhattan. This is the old green building from 1908 that is immediately to the left of the Staten Island Ferry building on the East Side of Lower Manhattan.

To get to the Battery Maritime Building via public transport is by the #1 train to South Ferry Station (only stops at Chambers on SAT/SUN), the 4/5 trains to Bowling Green, or the W/R trains to Whitehall Street.
